PROTECTION OF STUDENT RIGHTS UNDER 20 U.S.C. 1232h

Parents have the right to inspect all instructional materials, including teacher's manuals, films, tapes, or other supplementary material, that will be used in connection with any survey, analysis, or evaluation as part of any program funded in whole or in part by the U.S. Department of Education. Please contact your child's principal if you desire an appointment to review such materials.

If your children are under the age of 18, they shall not be required to participate in a survey, analysis, or evaluation as part of any program funded in whole or in part by the U.S. Department of Education that reveals information concerning the following topics without your prior written consent.

- 1. political affiliations or beliefs of the student or the student's parents;
- 2. mental and psychological problems of the student or the student's family;
- 3. sexual behaviors and attitudes;
- 4. illegal, anti-social, self-incrimination, and demeaning behavior;
- 5. critical appraisals of other individuals with whom students have close family relationships;
- 6. legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians, and ministers;
- 7. religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or student's parents; or
- 8. income (other than that required too determine a child's eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such a program).

If your children are 18 or older or are emancipated minors, they shall have the opportunity to give or withhold consent to participate in the survey, analysis, or evaluation.
