	Since Texas School for the Deaf does not receive funding for gifted and talented students our services are optional rather than man- dated and hence TSD may establish a process for identifying and serving gifted and talented students and shall establish a program for those students in each grade level. Texas School for the Deaf may establish a shared services arrangement with other districts. <i>Education Code 29.122</i>
DEFINITION	"Gifted and talented student" means a child or youth who performs at or shows the potential for performing at a remarkably high level of accomplishment when compared to others of the same age, ex- perience, or environment and who exhibits high performance ca- pability in an intellectual, creative, or artistic area, possesses an unusual capacity for leadership, or excels in a specific academic field. <i>Education Code 29.121</i>
IDENTIFICATION	Students may be identified as gifted/talented in accordance with a written procedure that includes:
	<ol> <li>Provisions for ongoing screening and selection of students who perform or show potential for performing at remarkably high levels of accomplishment in the areas defined in Educa- tion Code 29.121.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>Assessment measures collected from multiple sources ac- cording to each area defined in the Texas State Plan for the Education of Gifted/Talented Students.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>Data and procedures designed to ensure that students from all populations in a district have access to assessment and, if identified, to services provided for the gifted/talented program.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>Provisions for final selection of students to be made by a committee of at least three Texas School for the Deaf staff who have received training in the nature and needs of gifted students.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>Provisions regarding furloughs, reassessment, exiting of stu- dents from program services, transfer students, and appeals of district decisions regarding program placement.</li> </ol>

LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES	Texas School for the Deaf may provide an array of learning oppor- tunities for gifted/talented students in kindergarten through grade 12 and shall inform parents of the opportunities. Options may in- clude:

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS GIFTED AND TALENTED STUDENTS

- 1. Instructional and organizational patterns that enable identified students to work together as a group, to work with other students, and to work independently.
- 2. A continuum of learning experiences that leads to the development of advanced-level products and performances.
- 3. In-school, and when possible, out-of-school options relevant to the student's area of strength that are available during the school year.
- 4. Opportunities to accelerate in areas of strength.
